The Department of Political Science, MDK Girls' College organised a Lecture titled *India China Tussle: Context, Contestation and Challenges* on 30/08/2020 as a part of Department's annual lecture series. Two highly acclaimed resource persons in the academic field namely Dr. P. Krishna Mohan Reddy, Assistant Professor, Department of History, Sri Venkateswara University, Tirupati and Dr.Netajee Abhinandan, Assistant professor, Department of Political Science, Ravenshaw University, Cuttack delivered their expertise lecture in the academic field as resource person. The programme was inaugurated by Dr.Nibedita Phuakan, Principal ,MDK Girls college with her opening remark .The welcome speech was offered by Dr.Utpal Sut ,Coordinator IQAC stressing the importance of such an academic endeavour .In his lecture ,Prof P.K. Reddy deliberated on the historical legacy of Indo-China relation and its present status .While developing the discourse, prof Reddy also highlighted the geo-politics of Indo-China relations and its implication on the on-going tussle between the two major power of the Asia. Another resource person ,Dr.Netajee Abhinandan,a Chinese scholar deliberated on the contemporary relation between china and India mainly focusing on the areas of contestation, the reasons involved and the chasing competition between the two countries to become the hegemon of the Asia Pacific region. In his lecture Prof .Abhinandan expressed satisfaction about India's emerging capabilities in the defence and strategic sectors.
